RivMed Successfully Regains Foster Care Accreditation

In 2022, RivMed's accreditation faced a temporary deferral due to identified shortcomings in operational policies and procedures, leading to intervention and assistance from the Office of the Children's Guardian (OCG), the Department of Communities and Justice (DCJ) and AbSec, the peak organisation for Aboriginal children and families in NSW. At the time of deferral, 54 children were in care with their carers being supported by RivMed's case management and support teams. As a result, these cases were carefully transitioned to other organisations.

Working diligently with OCG, DCJ and AbSec, RivMed has implemented a comprehensive performance improvement plan to address the identified issues and implement actions that focus on providing culturally safe and positive environments for vulnerable children in care, facilitating connections with family and kinship structures, and ensuring a strong sense of identity within the Aboriginal community.

Peta Larsen, RivMed's Chief Executive Officer said the corporation has been granted full accreditation for three years without restrictions on the number of children in care, or the complexity of their needs.

"RivMed is accredited as a designated agency under the provisions in Schedule

3A to the Children's Guardian Act 2019," Ms Larsen said.

"We are now actively working with non-Aboriginal government organisations to transition Aboriginal children and cases to our dedicated team of First Nations staff, skilled in delivering effective foster care case management and support services,

"Through our model of care, Aboriginal children and their carers will receive culturally appropriate support with access to culture and community to help develop children's positive self-identity, encourage healing, and maintain a sense of belonging, especially for those who have been disconnected from their immediate family," Ms Larsen said.

In his notice of accreditation letter, NSW Children's Guardian Mr Stephen Kinmond OAM congratulated RivMed on this significant achievement.

"Given the improvement in systems and practice demonstrated by RivMed, I have removed the additional conditions previously imposed on RivMed,

"This includes the condition requiring RivMed to engage an external consultant with reportable conduct expertise and the condition limiting the number of children and young people to whom RivMed may provide statutory out-of-home care services to,

"I have informed the Department of Communities and Justice that there are no longer any restrictions imposed by my office on the number of children and young people who may be placed with RivMed,"

Since regaining its accreditation, RivMed has furthered its holistic Out of Home Care model by introducing cultural support plans. These are designed to preserve cultural heritage and identity, ensuring that no child loses touch with their culture or community.

"This accomplishment is a testament to RivMed's dedication to delivering positive outcomes for the Wagga Wagga Aboriginal community," Ms Larsen said.

"We thank the Board for their resilience throughout the recent adversity, and acknowledge the perseverance of the operational team, especially their commitment to improvement and growth,"

As a designated agency, information about RivMed's accreditation status is published on the Office of the Children's Guardian's website and accessible to the public.

Riverina Medical and Dental Aboriginal Corporation (RivMed) is thrilled to announce the launch of its newly redesigned website, aimed at providing comprehensive resources and information to support the constant growth and new programs for the First Nations people in the Wagga Wagga community.

The new website, accessible at www. rivmed.org.au, features an array of resources including detailed information about RivMed's extensive range of services, the history of the organization, and quick access to contact points for making bookings and becoming a foster carer. This initiative marks a significant step forward in RivMed's mission to provide culturally appropriate and accessible health and care services to Aboriginal families in the region.

RivMed Chief Executive Officer Peta Larsen said the website was long-coming and required collaboration from all program areas to get it right.

"We are very proud of our new website, the relaunch was a much-needed project that will keep the community and families updated with the services available at RivMed,"

"As a community-controlled organisation, we are committed to transparency with the community as we continue to provide culturally appropriate and accessible healthcare and services that improve the lives of Aboriginal people and their families living in the Wagga Wagga region," Ms Larsen said.

In addition to the core services, the new website highlights the newly opened RivMed Wellness Centre. This facility offers a space for physical health and wellbeing programs facilitated by RivMed. Established through a joint investment by the New South Wales Government and Aboriginal Affairs New South Wales, the Wellness Centre aims to enhance local efforts towards closing the health gap for First Nations people.

As RivMed continues to grow, it strives to recruit talented professionals for both identified and non-identified positions within the organization. This effort ensures that RivMed remains a community-controlled entity fostering a model of care that empowers children, families, and carers to feel nurtured and connected.

Yalbilinya Miya

Yalbilinya Miya (Learn Together): A First Nations Led Initiative for Breastfeeding Support

The Yalbilinya Miya program, meaning "learn together," is an Aboriginal-led initiative designed to support Koori women in their breastfeeding journeys.

Led by the Riverina Medical and Dental Aboriginal Corporation (RivMed) in collaboration with the Poche Centre for Indigenous Health, University of Sydney, this program aims to reclaim and strengthen traditional breastfeeding practices that have nurtured Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander babies for over 65,000 years.

Program Highlights

- Community-Driven Research: The program gathers insights from Koori women living on Wiradjuri lands (Wagga Wagga) through Yarning Circles and one-on-one sessions. This participatory approach ensures that the program is grounded in the real experiences and needs of the community.
- Comprehensive Support: The initiative includes a tailored breastfeeding education program led by a Wiradjuri midwife and antenatal team. Participants have access to weekly breastfeeding support sessions, a dedicated breastfeeding support hotline, and personalized breastfeeding packs that include essential items such as electric breast pumps and culturally designed cover-ups.

- Culturally Safe Training: Key program leaders, including Aboriginal Health Workers and midwives, receive specialized lactation training to provide culturally safe and effective support to breastfeeding mothers.
- •Empowering Women: By addressing the impacts of colonization and systemic inequities, the program seeks to empower Koori women to continue traditional breastfeeding practices, providing the best start to life for their babies and fostering stronger motherchild bonds.

Challenges Addressed:

- Lack of Support: The program addresses the need for more breastfeeding mentors, culturally safe lactation consultants, and supportive policies in workplaces and public spaces.
- Systemic Barriers: Issues such as racism in healthcare, lack of Aboriginal midwives, and the commercial influence of formula companies are being tackled to create a more supportive environment for breastfeeding mothers.
- Education and Resources: The program emphasizes the importance of educating both healthcare providers and the community about the benefits of breastfeeding and providing resources to help mothers navigate challenges like latching issues, low milk supply, and mental health concerns.

'Breastfeeding is the most beautiful and natural way of feeding our babies. Breast is best, anytime and anywhere, and this program will help to ensure all of our women have the tools and supports available to guide them through their breastfeeding journeys' – Aunty Donna Kirby











Next Steps:

- Pilot Program Implementation: the program will design, implement, and evaluate a pilot breastfeeding support initiative.
- Lactation Training Framework: the project will develop a framework for an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander lactation training program.



Team Building & Staff Upskilling


